

IAN W.H. PARRY, has been a Fellow in the Energy and Natural Resources Division of Resources for the Future since 1995. He has taught at Georgetown University, Australian National University, University of Chicago, and the Center for Research and Graduate Education in Prague. He has also worked at the Economic Research Service of the US Department of Agriculture.

Parry received his Ph.D. in economics from the University of Chicago in 1993. His thesis was on global warming and his advisors were Gary Becker, Sherwin Rosen and George Tolley. He received an M.A. in economics from the University of Warwick (England) in 1987 and a B.A. (first class honors) in economics from the University of Sheffield (England) in 1986.

Parry's research focuses mainly on the theoretical and empirical evaluation of environmental policies, transportation policies, and tax policies. He has studied the efficiency of different policy options for reducing both pollution and traffic congestion. He has also studied how these policies interact with the tax system, and the impact of environmental policies on technological innovation. Parry has also done work on the optimal level of gasoline taxation, and the economic impacts of agricultural policies, trade policies, and health policies.
