He will provide the perspective of national and worldwide scientists on the scope and immediacy of the problem.

Billy Connelly, marketing executive with Native Energy, Inc. in Charlotte, Vermont, will describe his company's international renewable energy business and their carbon offset projects assisting communities in reducing CO2 emissions and building sustainable economies.

Charles Bass, former NH Congressman and member of Republicans for Environmental Protection, will serve as moderator.
