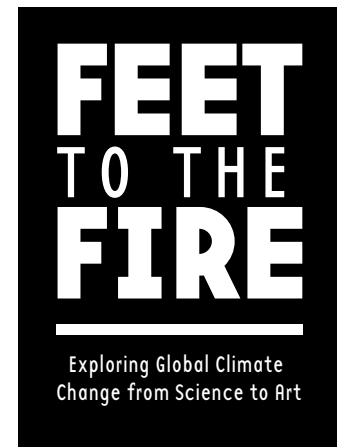

THE FESTIVAL

The goal of the family-friendly Festival is to deepen our community's understanding of global climate change and sustainable living through multiple lenses. It will feature interactive displays and exhibits on energy conservation and sustainability by environmental scientists and a farmer's market with local organic food vendors. We are seeking exhibits that engage visitors in learning about home energy efficiency, renewable energy technology, recycling, local organic gardening, locally grown produce, eco-friendly landscaping, open space preservation, the need for sensitive development practices, wildlife habitat preservation, biodiversity, the carbon cycle and carbon credits, watershed protection, the economic and humanitarian costs of global warming, economic opportunities in mitigating climate change, policy advocacy, educational outreach, technical innovation, transportation choices, and legislative solutions. Vendors of locally grown food and eco-friendly products are welcome. Enjoy performances, art and music by campus and regional artists, while learning about the impact of climate change on our world. Award-winning choreographer Ann Carlson will premiere a new site-specific work commissioned by the Festival.

The Festival is a part of an eighteen-month project, funded in part by a grant from the Association of Performing Arts Presenters Creative Campus Innovations Grant Program, a component of the Doris Duke Charitable Foundation. Additional partners are the Center for Creative Research and the Green Street Arts Center.

INFORMATION FOR ECO-FRIENDLY VENDORS AND EXHIBITORS

The Festival provides:

- A space approximately 10 feet wide by 10 feet deep
- One table, two chairs beneath a tent (exhibitor must provide table covering)
- Signs for each vendor

- Listing in the festival brochure
- A fee of \$50 per space will be charged to vendors selling food and products. Exhibitors not selling products will not be charged.
